Problem	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Segregation</li> <li>→ means the boys cannot go to the store together or swim in the pool once it is covered over</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Segregation in this story means there is a fence that divides the town's citizen by race.</li> </ul>
Similarities:	<p>The problems in both stories are related to segregation. Segregation divides both towns activities and access.</p>	
Resolution	<p>Even though their town was still segregated, Joe + John Henry walked in to Mr. Mason's store together to buy ice pops.</p>	<p>Even though their town was still segregated, Annie and Clover played together with the other girls and sat on the fence wishing that the fence would come down one day.</p>
Similarities:	<p>The resolutions in both stories depend on the bravery of four (4) children who want things to be different in their towns. Annie crosses the fence to play with Clover and John Henry enters the store with Joe to buy ice pops.</p>	

## John Henry

- determined - He wanted to do everything Joe could do - swim in town pool, buy ice pops at Mr. Mason's.
- brave - He goes in store with Joe ~~to~~ at end of story, even though the store was segregated.
- <sup>a good</sup> friend - <sup>he</sup> Played with Joe all summer, swimming in the creek and bugging Annie Mae.
